Please note that it is not sufficient to inform the chair of your panel or some other individual of your desire to withdraw. YOU MUST INFORM THE PROGRAM CHAIR DIRECTLY at the above email address.

Second, in order to secure your place on the final program, you must pre-register for the conference by DECEMBER 30, 2004.
